

The Global Jewry Prize for Emerging Collaboration



Provides \$10,000 in seed funding (paid 50% at time of award and 50% upon submission of 6-month progress report) and visibility to promising new partnerships among members of the Global Jewry network. This prize is designed to incentivize and catalyze fresh initiatives with the potential for lasting impact.

Visionary Thinking	Breakthrough idea; bold, creative, and potentially transformative for the Jewish world.	Clear, compelling idea with creative elements and meaningful potential. Demonstrated Trust / Readiness	Strong evidence of authentic relationships, mutual respect, and readiness to collaborate.	Clear signals of trust and intent to work together.	Some connection and alignment but needs more depth or clarity.	Early-stage relationship; minimal evidence of trust or alignment.	No visible partnership or relational foundation.
Strategic Fit	Deep alignment with partners' missions and clearly addresses a pressing communal need.	Good mission fit and relevance to shared goals.	Adequate alignment with room for clearer purpose.	Weak alignment or loosely defined shared need.	Poor fit or unclear connection between partners and project.
Collaborative Creativity	Innovative use of each organization's strengths; partnership adds clear value.	Creative and thoughtful approach to working together.	Reasonably collaborative; some creativity shown.	Basic or imbalanced partnership; little added value.	No visible creativity or synergy in collaboration.
Catalytic Potential	High potential to spark broader collaboration, replication, or systemic change.	Good potential for scaling or inspiring others.	Some ripple effects possible but not yet clear.	Limited potential beyond immediate partners.	Unlikely to extend impact beyond initial scope.
